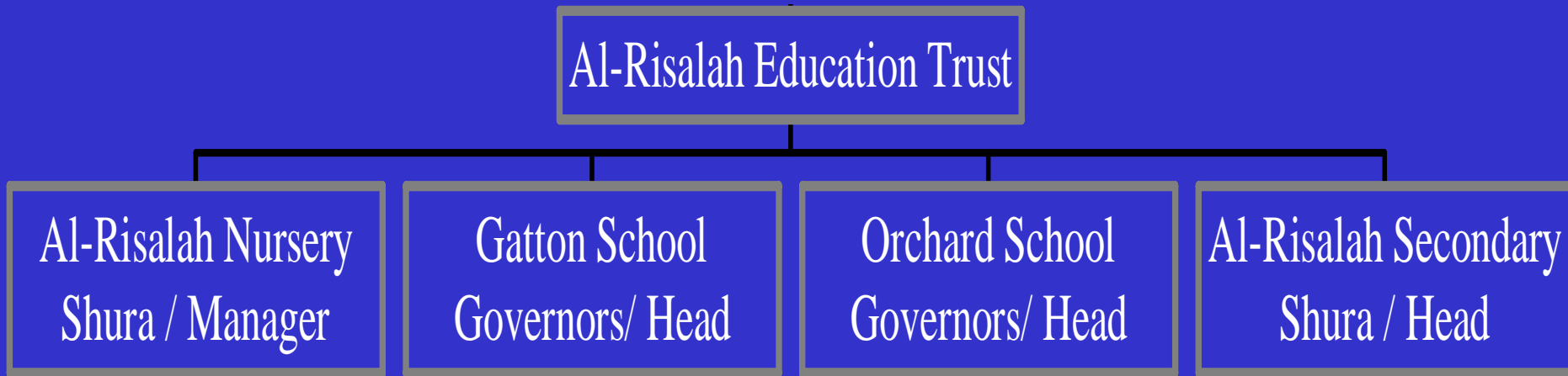

- 1993- Balham Preparatory School established by Balham Mosque
- 1996- Developing TIC for School/ Madrasah purposes
- 1997- Secondary girls moved to TIC
- 1998- Al-Risalah Education Trust established due to restructuring of Balham Mosque
- 2000- (July) Shura decided to apply for VA status
- 2001- DCSF and SOC approves our Primary proposal to build a new school
- 2003 - Orchard School established at the Memon centre
- 2004- 1. Gatton joins the maintain sector
- 2. Nursery moves to new premises
- 2005- Orchard moves to new premises in Streatham
- 2006- 1. Gatton moves to new premises
- 2. Orchard joins the maintain sector.
- 2007- Purchased 20 Broadwater Road for improving play space and enhancing facilities
- 2008- Completion of building works at Gatton
- 2009- Working towards improving facilities for both Secondary and Orchard
- 2010- Consider future direction of both Primary Schools with reference to Academies

Hadith of Rasool
