



## **Sports Premium Report for 2015 -2016**

### **Principles Informing the Use of the Sports Premium Grant**

- The Sports Premium was introduced to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles. It is allocated to schools to work with all pupils.
- This funding is specifically targeted at improving the provision of physical education (PE) and sport.

### **Orchard School Context**

Orchard is a one form entry school serving a deprived intake. It is positioned high in the upper quartile of the most deprived schools in Lambeth (top 25%) based on eligibility for free school meals (FSM), inward mobility and pupils at earlier stages of English (Lambeth Schools Disadvantage Index). FSM pupil numbers are high compared to the local and national averages. The vast majority of pupils come from a minority ethnic background and have English as an additional language.

Pupils entering Reception include some with very little or no pre-school experience and a majority at an early stage of English.

There are 25 pupils per class, therefore cohort / group size and other factors (e.g. SEN) tend to have a stronger impact on the attainment and progress data compared to larger schools.

### **Aim of this report**

The aim of this report is to outline the impact of the Sports Premium spend at The Orchard Primary school for 2015 -2016. The Sports Premium spending is integral to the school's drive towards promoting the personal development, health and wellbeing of all pupils at Orchard Primary. Thus our approach and vision for all pupils is to ensure that they are offered 'rich opportunities and a range of memorable experiences' related to sports.

Our decisions on how best to use the 'Sports Premium' are based on the findings of high quality research and publications, as well as OFSTED's own 'best practice' guides. These have supported our decision on expenditure over the best and most effective use of our Sport Premium Funding.

The Sports Premium spend also contributes to the overall aims and mission of Orchard Primary School which:

- *has Islamic values at its heart*
- *is a place where every child matters*
- *is dedicated to the spiritual, academic and social development of all of its pupils*
- *is committed to a rich curriculum and strong community partnerships*
- *is building a firm foundation of Emaan for the pleasure of Allah and to promote lifelong learning*

The school was allocated £8700 for improving PE and sports. The school carried out a range of activities to help achieve this aim. These are outlined below:

There has been a greater range of sport skills being developed including, volleyball, gymnastics, aerobic routines, netball and tennis – in addition to the range of skills outlined within the PE curriculum. Lesson observations have also evidenced the active participation of all pupils on Pupil Premium (PP) and SEND. Links were made with SMSC to ensure pupils’ skills were built up through the PE lessons (e.g. working as a team and the giving and receiving of constructive feedback on performance). Pupils have identified how their skills have improved and what they have particularly enjoyed. The PE curriculum met the requirements of the New National Curriculum.

Also utilised by pupils during Sports Day, etc. This has been evidenced through lesson observations and pupil feedback.
