



Sports Premium Plan Impact Report for 2016 -2017

The school was given a Sports Premium allocation of £8500 for improving PE and sporting skills. The school carried out a range of activities to help achieve this aim. These are outlined below, together with the impact:

Improve the quality of teaching and learning related to physical education	Amount set aside: £7500 (Contributing towards the total cost).	One PE session per week for all classes led by specialist PE coaches.	Moving Matters – qualified and trained coaches – full academic year provision.	Pupils have developed skills in a wider range of sport including, volleyball, gymnastics, aerobic routines, netball and tennis – in addition to the range of skills outlined within the PE curriculum. There has been greater participation on an inter-school competitive level for all pupils including those on Pupil Premium (PP) and SEND. Both the girls and boys football teams performed very well in the cluster football tournaments. Girls also took part in the netball tournament. Links were made with SMSC to ensure pupils' skills are built up through the PE lessons (e.g. working as a team and the giving and receiving of constructive feedback on performance). The PE requirements of the New National Curriculum are being fully met.
		Development of PE teaching skills of teachers.	Moving Matters – provided qualified and trained coaches who are also developing teachers.	Modelling of good to outstanding lessons to teachers by the specialist coaches. Teachers have become more confident and are now leading the second PE session for the week independently. This development and CPD of teachers is ongoing.
Development of swimming skills	Amount set aside: £500 (Contributing towards the total cost).	One PE session per week for all Year 4 pupils led by specialist swimming coach at an off-site venue.	Specialist swimming coaches at Gatton Primary School – full academic year Provision.	Almost all pupils have shown progress in developing confidence in the water. Lessons have been differentiated to meet the varying skills of all learners. PP and SEND pupils, have also developed their swimming skills well.

Purchasing of additional sports equipment and resources.	Amount set aside: £500 (Contributing towards the total cost).	Resources purchased in order to enhance learning. Utilised during PE, special sports events and after school clubs.	Purchased by school for use throughout the year.	Equipment is widely used throughout the day during PE lessons, lunch time sporting events and after school clubs. Also utilised by pupils during Sports Day, etc. This has been evidenced through lesson observations and pupil feedback.
